Successes On and Off the Field



With 15 competitive sports, Menlo is a part of the California Pacific Conference with teams located throughout California and Arizona.

Since 2006, we have produced 31 All Americans and over 160 All Conference award winners. We have earned the NAIA Five Star Champions of Character award in 2009-2010 and 2010-2011.

Overall, Menlo College student-athletes are hardworking, driven students, leaders in the community, and champions on and off the field.

The womens soccer program hired current coach, Scott Myers, in 2010 as their first ever full-time head coach. Since his arrival students improved their successes on the field and in the classroom. The roster has taken a more diverse look with students coming from out of state as well as from foreign countries. Myers feels, "Soccer is only a small part of the goal of our program. My enjoyment does not end when individuals score goals or the team wins games, but instead when I see one of our atheltes names on the Dean's list or when one of our seniors gets their first job that is the true mark of success of a program." Fortunately the women's soccer team has been able to place over 20+ atheltes on the Deans List (GPA of 3.25 or higher) and 3 NAIA Scholar Atheltes (GPA of 3.5 and at least a Junior Standing) since Myers has taken over in 2010.

Menlo College's Women's soccer program has seen an increase in attention from club and high school players across the country because the coaching staff is focused on finding the right student-athletes for the program not just the best players. "Not everyone gets accepted into our family. You and the program have to be the perfect fit." The program has grown into a close tight nit family where academic standards are held high and drama kept at bay. The ladies of the program understand when they join the program they join a family for life where the lessons learned at Menlo will help them become a more successful individual in every aspect of life.

With the success of recruiting better and more talented students athletes into the program and the addition of athletic scholarships, the future for the Menlo women's soccer is bright. The level of play has matched the high academic standards coach Myers has instilled in the members of the program. The future is bright and with continued hard work this team will no doubt find itself in the national tournament in a very short time.
